Steve Rostam gave up the below updates regarding the LADOT

a. LADOT

- i. Additional signs directing traffic North on Cahuenga to the freeways that will re-direct to Lankershim on ramp
LADOT went out and looked at this area and aren't going to change the signage for 2 reasons; most of the traffic travels on the streets that GPS systems and WAZE directs you to go and changing this sign will have minimum impact on the traffic. Also, Lankershim would require 2 additional turns to get onto the 134 freeway and Cahuenga is more of a direct shot for the freeway
- ii. Traffic Light at Addison and Cahuenga
this will be another estimated 18 months Fully funded and approved but work expected to be done fourth quarter of 2020.
- iii. Exit at Cahuenga/134 – Crosswalk
the walk signal has been fixed to have a 5 second head start before the cars....updated on January 24th
- iv. Clybourn/Riverside Crosswalk
waiting for funding for flashing lights....hopefully September 2020
- v. Valley Spring Lane/ Cahuenga Blvd. Crosswalk
this was reviewed back in 2016 and denied for lack of community support
